Database	Description
<a href="#">American Government (ABC-CLIO)</a>	The American Government database connects issues of the day with the foundations of government and compares the political and economic systems of the United States with other countries.
<a href="#">American History (ABC-CLIO)</a>	Encompasses critical essays, biographies, court cases, primary source documents, and media.
<a href="#">A to Z World Cultures</a>	Global knowledge for culture, history, language, education, food, holidays, superstitions, and folklore.
<a href="#">Bloom's Literary Reference Online (FOF)</a>	Includes author biographies of authors worldwide. Includes overviews, synopses, analyses, and literary criticism of many works. Articles on literary movements and groups, magazines and newspapers, and historical events. There are timelines and information on literary characters.
<a href="#">Consumer Reports (EBSCO)</a>	Access to the collection of Consumer Reports magazine.
<a href="#">ERead Illinois</a>	Ebook available through the State of Illinois program. There are thousands of titles available. Axis 360 is the app you can use to read these books on your phone or device.
<a href="#">Explora Educator's Edition</a>	Offers lesson plans, support materials, and professional development resources.
<a href="#">Explora Secondary Schools</a>	Designed for high school students. Students can browse topics of interest or search for a topic of their choice. Search results can be limited to source type (e.g., magazines, news, biographies, etc.) or by Lexile range.
<a href="#">Noodle Tools</a>	A source citation database to help organize MLA and APA citations in the correct order with proper punctuation. Click on the link and select 'Register' - Enter your Student ID and create a password.
<a href="#">Opposing Viewpoints (Gale)</a>	Based on the book series this database highlights both sides to major societal issues.
<a href="#">Pop Culture Universe (ABC-CLIO)</a>	A database that explores popular culture in America both past and present.
<a href="#">Science in Context (Gale)</a>	A research database that includes magazine and newspaper articles, academic articles, primary sources, critical essays, and reference materials covering all areas of science.
