

SEMESTER EXAMS

Please note that there is a \$55.42 charge per exam taken outside of the regularly scheduled exam periods.

Our very generous Parent-Faculty-Student-Association (PFSA) will be recognizing our staff with a lovely luncheon on Monday, May 6th. I am sure it will be quite a treat!

Advanced Placement Exams begin Monday, May 6th and continue through May 17th, seniors' last day. Traditionally, our students have done exceedingly well and we expect no less this year. We wish our students continued success in this year's efforts to earn eligibility for college credit through the College Board exams. Almost simultaneously during the second week of AP exams, our seniors will launch into their final semester exam schedule. These tests are part of the evaluation process and do affect each senior's final grade and transcript.

I would be remiss if I didn't share our excitement for District 230 Relay for Life which will take place on May 10th. Currently, we have nearly 1,000 students signed up to participate as members of over 100 teams. We are also anxiously awaiting for Varsity Brands to announce the winner of the America's Most Spirited High School contest. Sandburg has advanced to the final five, but we are hoping to bring home the top prize!

To the parents of our graduating seniors, I say thank you for not only your commitment and love in raising your child but also for your support of Carl Sandburg High School.

District 230 to Check Residency Annually

In the district's ongoing efforts to be fiscally responsible, all District 230 students need to show proof of residency within the district boundaries on an annual basis, similar to when students first enrolled at Carl Sandburg High School. This procedure has been put into place to protect the financial interest of taxpayers in District 230 by assuring that the students who receive an education in our schools are legally entitled to do so.

NEW for returning students for the 2019-2020 school year is a secure, online form submission process that is being piloted to ease the process of turning in residency and medical forms. The district

is excited about the modernization of this process and appreciates families' patience as we implement the new system. Families interested in this new online verification process must use the link found on the Guidance Department webpage under "Annual Proof of Residency" to complete each required field and upload all documents. All required documents must be uploaded as **individual files**. Once submitted, all documents will be reviewed by staff to assure authenticity. The documentation necessary to complete this process can be found in the chart shown below. Uploaded documents not found on this list will be denied, and

families will be required to re-submit ALL documentation for additional review. **Partial residency documentation will not be accepted.**

For families who wish to complete this process in person, the final date to do so will be held on Saturday, May 4, 2019, from 8:00 am-12:00 noon in the Commons. Please park in the West lot and enter through the W8 door.

Journey Toward Biliteracy Celebration

On Wednesday, April 24th, a recognition breakfast was held to celebrate Class of 2019 students who have earned the State Seal of Biliteracy or the Commendation toward Biliteracy. Thirty-five Sandburg seniors met State eligibility criteria for the Seal and 58 did so for the Commendation. Dr. Gay, Principal Tyrrell and several other district and Sandburg administrators were present and assisted in awarding students with certificates and commemorative pins. Students, parents, and all Sandburg World Languages teachers attended the breakfast.

A main feature of the ceremony was student participation in their learned second language. Eight different students spoke at various points in the ceremony, featuring learning in French, German, Latin and Spanish. The highlight of the ceremony consisted of the personal stories shared by students in which they detailed the powerful impact that learning a second language has had on their lives and worldviews.

This year's graduating Class of 2019 will be the first in District 230 to receive the Seal of Biliteracy and the Commendation toward Biliteracy. Illinois was the fourth state in the nation to adopt the Seal of Biliteracy in 2013 and is one of 36 states and the District of Columbia who currently offer this recognition. High school students must demonstrate intermediate-high to advanced levels of proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English to be eligible to receive the Seal of Biliteracy. Over 100 students district-wide took the AAPPL and ALIRA assessments this past March to demonstrate proficiency in a second language. Several dozen more took AP Language exams as juniors, earning scores that also served to qualify for this prestigious recognition. Students earning the Seal of Biliteracy will benefit from informing potential employers of their biliteracy skills as well as the requirement that public community colleges and universities in Illinois must account for the Seal in their admissions process and grant appropriate foreign language credit. Congratulations to all Seal and Commendation Eagles!



What's on Your Mind...

Notes From The Social Workers & School Psychologist Mental Health Awareness



Since 1949, mental health affiliates have been celebrating Mental Health Awareness Month during the month of May in order to break the stigma "Approximately 60 million individuals in the United States face the day-to-day reality of managing the symptoms of a mental illness." Half of all lifetime mental health conditions begin by age 14 and 75% by age 24" (NAMI.org). If unaddressed, mental health problems can hinder a student's learning, relationships, and even physical health. Due to this, early intervention is key. Do not ignore symptoms and write them off as "growing pains." Although every

illness has its own unique characteristics some common symptoms include: changes in appetite and sleeping patterns, withdrawal, losing interest in things, significant mood changes, excessive sadness or worry, and complaining of physical ailments without a known cause just to mention a few.

If you have concerns about your child's mental health, please speak with your child's physician or contact their school social worker/psychologist for more information and/or referrals.

Eagles Decision Day

May 1 is the "National College Decision Day", a date set for seniors to notify college admissions offices of their intent to attend their institution. Since we know how important all post-high school decisions are for our students, the Sandburg Guidance Department will be hosting our own celebration event during all lunch periods in the Commons.

Seniors will be encouraged to write their name and post-high school plan on a blue Eagle to be displayed on banners outside of the Guidance Department. A small gift will be given to each senior for this awesome achievement. Be sure to stop down in the Commons to see this display on May 1.

2019-2020 Schedules Available In August

Student class schedules for 2019-2020 will be available for release in August.

Course changes can be made during the first five days of the semester. Level change requests can be discussed with

teachers and department chairs any time during the first or third quarters. **Requests for teacher, lunch and/or period preferences are not a valid reason for a schedule change.**

PSAT/NMSQT Testing

(Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test)

The PSAT will be administered to all junior students on October 16, 2019. We will communicate more information about this test administration in the fall of 2019. The PSAT/NMSQT is a practice test used to assist students in preparing for the SAT. A student who does well on this exam and who meets other academic criteria may

qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program. National Merit Scholars are the nation's top 1% of all test takers and are eligible for certain scholarships. Information about the PSAT/NMSQT can be found at <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt-psat-10>.

The College Board has partnered with Khan Academy to offer free SAT test prep to students. Students should create their account now to view full-length practice tests, short quizzes, practice questions, video lessons, tips and feedback on their progress.

Web-Based Resources for Career & College Tips

The Sandburg Guidance Department offers a variety of web-based resources to assist students with finding career and college information. Students often feel great stress when adults ask them, "What do you want to be?" In the ever-changing job market with over 100,000 careers to choose from, making this decision is a challenge. This summer is a good time for your student to explore his or her options.

- **Career Cruising** includes career matching tools, detailed occupation profiles, and a national database of colleges, universities, career and technical schools (www.careercruising.com).

- **College Board** has a great site "BigFuture" that helps students create a road map (and save the information into their College Board account) find colleges, explore careers, research financial aid options, and receive tips on applying, writing essays, taking standardized tests and making final decisions (<https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/>).

These sites can be accessed from home via the internet or from the Sandburg school network. Students needing help using these programs should see their counselor in Guidance.

Senior Final Transcript Requests

Since May 1 is the official date for seniors to notify colleges and universities of their official acceptance, there is no need to wait to request your final transcript!

Seniors should log in their Parchment account and place this request. Be sure to select "Hold for Grades," and our Registrar will submit your final transcript once grades are posted. If your college or university is not listed in Parchment, we will obtain that information from your Senior Clearance Sheet on Check-Out Day and mail your transcript directly to their admissions office.

News From The Nurse's Office

Health Record Requirements for Incoming Freshmen and Transfer Students

According to Illinois School Code, all students must have a complete physical on the Illinois Certificate of Child Health Exam Form prior to entry into high school, including an up-to-date immunization record before receiving a class schedule. All students are required to have:

- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis series; Tdap booster
- Two (2) doses of measles, mumps, rubella vaccine (MMR)-1st dose having been given on or after the 1st birthday
- Polio vaccine series with booster given on or after the 4th birthday
- Two (2) doses of varicella vaccine (the 1st dose having been given on or after the 1st birthday)
- Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B according to the required schedule
- One dose of Meningococcal vaccine after the 11th birthday. A second dose is required for all incoming seniors (to be given after their 16th birthday).

The form for the physical is two sided.

- Your physician must sign and date to verify immunization record and again after the physical portion with his/her stamp, including phone number.
- Parents must complete and sign a comprehensive health history. This is a mandated portion of the state's physical form and it is on the top of the second page of the physical. Please be sure that all signatures are present before returning your form to school.
- The nurse is required by law to **RETURN** any physicals **NOT** in compliance with the law. **DOUBLE CHECK** that all signatures are present.
- **Always make a copy for your records.**

Important reminders

- Each student must also have a **pink emergency sheet** on file in the Nurse's Office.
- Please remember that no student will be able to receive their schedule for the 2019-2020 school year until all medical records are in compliance with the state law and on file in the Nurse's Office.
- Send your forms in as soon as they are complete to avoid a delay in getting your class schedule.
- The Nurse's Office is closed in the summer. Physical and emergency forms are available online during the summer.
- Dental Examinations are required for incoming Freshmen.
- **Completed forms should be mailed or turned into the Nurse's Office by May 24, 2019.**

Reminder For Freshmen Athletes

A separate sports physical is not needed for freshman athletes.

If a student is planning to participate in a sport, his/her physical needs to be obtained on or after May 1, 2019 to assure eligibility for the complete school year.

- Please make sure the doctor circles **YES** for interscholastic sports
- This must be done prior to the student trying out for a sport
- Keep a copy, give a copy to your coach and send **the original** to the Nurse

ATTENTION Parents of Incoming Sophomore, Junior and Senior students:

If there are any changes in emergency contact or health information, please complete a new pink emergency form and turn it into the school nurse.

Pick Up College Immunization Records

Seniors who need to provide a copy of their immunization record to their college should request a copy from the Nurse's Office by Friday, May 10th. The Nurse is not in during the summer and records are not available without advanced notice. Immunization records for students who do not pick them up will be given to students with their diploma.

Lost Eyeglasses??

The Nurse's Office has prescription eyeglasses that have been lost by students throughout the school year. Please have your student stop by the Nurse's Office before the end of the school year if they have lost or misplaced their eyeglasses. Any glasses left in our office at the end of May will be donated at the end of the school year.

Attention Junior Parents/Guardians (Class of 2020)

All incoming senior students will need proof of having a dose of Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine on or after their 16th birthday.

The following action is needed from you at this time:

- If your child received a dose of this immunization on or after their 16th birthday, please bring your physician verified immunization record to the Nurse's Office.
- If your child has not had this required vaccine they must have it and bring the verification of having received it to the Nurse's Office.

Medications At School:

Please pick up medications in the Nurse's Office by the last day of school. Medication not picked up will be discarded.

If your student takes medication at school, please remember to send a new Medication Form prior to the start of the 2019-2020 school year. This form needs to be updated each school year for your student to continue receiving his/her medication.
